


Year 6 Secondary School Information Evening.

TRANSITION MODEL YEAR 6 Looking, choosing and applying.

Time to consider and visit schools you may wish your child to attend.

Once you have chosen, and visited; register to attend open mornings and taster days. You may wish to book a meeting this half term with Mr Carter to discuss options.

Applications will now be open and deadlines will be clearly presented on the school's website.

Support child's well-being throughout the exam process. The new school counsellor will speak with the children on <u>16th October</u> and host a <u>Parent Education coffee morning on managing stress levels (7th October at 8.15-9.00am)</u>

Let Miss Rule and the class teacher know dates your child will be absent - open days and exams - could all be on the same day.

Wait for communication from the school/s you have applied for.

Decide on the most suitable school for your child and accept place. If in doubt, please ask us – we are here to help.

Year 6 Autumn Term

Lesson content will continue on from where the children were in the Summer term of Year 5, with constant dialogue between the staff to ensure continuity and progression of skills.

- *Exam techniques and strategies are covered in weekly VR and NVR sessions with deputy head teacher, Mrs West.
- * We will continue to use an online learning platform to support VR/NVR.
- *Timed maths and comprehension papers as well as writing assignments are built into the curriculum, along with the necessary skills required for each to support pupils' confidence and time management.
- *Opportunities to go through papers together and give immediate feedback.
- *Mr. Carter, Mrs. Dodd, Mrs Moorley, Mrs Michael and Mrs Mantle will continue to support and teach small groups.
- * Opportunity to experience exam conditions in a hall.
- *Write CVs (used in transition reports).
- *Weekly interview technique lessons with Mrs West, where pupils go over questions that they might expect to hear.
- *Mock interviews and feedback are held in the second half of the term with Mr Carter and school governor Mrs Lowe for those applying for Independent schools.

Independent schools will all have their own individual application process. Some schools will have stage one (an exam) and then call students back. Others may have an exam and interview on the same day.

Some selective school may have two stages.

Application deadline is usually at the end of October - Please see all websites for exact dates.

Exams are usually between December and January.

Please check all the school websites for application deadlines, dates for entrance exams and process.

Scholarships - Things to consider.

Academic scholarships are invited back <u>automatically</u>.

Music, Sports and Performing Arts Scholarships are a small discount off the fees.

Please speak to the Head of Prep for support and advice if thinking about going for a scholarship. We will endorse it as a school. We have a professional trust and reputation with schools.

These extra days for the scholarship are on top of the exam. It is a huge amount of responsibility and commitment; if you accept a scholarship in this area - expect your child to be part of sports teams/music groups.

Application for a scholarship **does not** impact exam result/ outcome.

Scholarships are for those who really excel in that particular curriculum area. Please take the advice from the specialist teachers and Miss Rule.

Relationship with schools:

Timeline Year 6 Spring Term

Exams should be over by the end of January.

Spring and Summer Term – 6

- Power of Reading English.
- Management responsibility Independence and Resilience.
- Well-being sessions and specific PSHE sessions to support the transition into Year 7.
- Expectations for Year 7.
- After all exams are finished, both classes will continue with the Year 6 curriculum and be given exciting projects to carry out. We will have a real focus on **Independence and Teamwork.**

Top Tips

Listen to advice from Miss Rule, Mr Pretara and Mr. Carter.

Remember the school is for your child – consider all viable options.

Do not send children to entrance exams for 'Practice'. This will not benefit them in any way, in fact, it could be detrimental to their self-esteem and confidence.

Tutors can help with technique and support – Please speak to Mr Carter or Miss Rule for advice.

Do not overload your child with endless test papers – this may lead to stress and anxiety.

Speak **positively and openly** about all schools especially in front of them.

Spend time with your children; discuss world events, explore new places/exhibits and read - it is the single most impactful thing they can do!

Stay calm – if in doubt, please ask for support.
