#### Dear Parents,

The weeks continue to flash by, and now we are near the end of our first month back at school, and it seems we are also getting to the end of any dry, sunny days!

This week in assembly, with Black History Month just around the corner, I spoke to the children about celebrating modern heroes and how we can all be heroes too. The aim was to highlight inspiring figures from Black British history who are making a difference today and encourage the children to reflect on how they can be heroes in

their own right. We discussed well-known individuals like Marcus Rashford, who helped ensure children had access to free meals during the COVID-19 pandemic, Dina Asher-Smith, an Olympic sprinter and role model for girls and women, and Stormzy, who supports talented students through scholarships. These modern-day heroes show us that anyone can create positive change. I encouraged the pupils to think about ways they could help others, whether by speaking out

against unfairness like Marcus Rashford, setting goals and working hard like Dina Asher-Smith, or supporting opportunities like Stormzy. Heroism doesn't require superpowers—just kindness, bravery, and a commitment to making the world a better place!

We also held our Phonics meeting on Monday for our Reception parents. It was fantastic to see so many of you there, getting a sense of how our structured programme works and how you can support your child's learning at home. Thank you so much to Mrs Oliver and Mrs Cornish for this presentation and for their work with the pupils. We understand that it's not always easy to attend events in person, so we're currently exploring the option of running a hybrid version of future parent events. This would mean holding meetings both in -person and remotely, allowing more parents to participate. While it may not be perfect, as remote sessions can sometimes miss out on the interactive elements, we hope it will help us accommodate all parents who want to engage.

Finally, we had our first Open Morning of the term for prospective parents, which was incredibly well



attended which is a very positive outlook for the future! Our Year 6 pupils did an exceptional job as ambassadors for the School, guiding parents around and showcasing the very best of what we have to offer. We received so many positive comments about how wellbehaved and focused all our students were during class visits-a real testament to the fantastic community we have here. Additionally, seeing as I mentioned heroes at the start of the newsletter, a big thank you, as always, to my own superhero, Mrs

Jeffery, who puts so much energy into these events, and parents get treated to her warm and cheery demeanour that you will all know so well and will have experienced from her as current parents. 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#### ECHO Debate Club

The children in Prep School have had the opportunity to hone their debating skills and develop their discussion and persuasion abilities through a series of skill building activities each week with Mr Chowdhury and Mr Murphy.

In week one, children looked at what techniques we use to persuade one another - in day to day conversations - by taking on the Remote Island challenge. Imagining that they were marooned on a desert island, what special items would you save and which would you choose to discard?

During week two, the children developed their use of explanation to support a key point. We used a variety of statements to practise, rehearse and respond to each other's persuasive suggestions, with a judge hearing opposing opinions in a Conscience Alley. Once all points had been heard, the Judge made their own decision, solely based upon the points and responses made. Heated responses were generated when responding to: 'Your teeth should be brushed before you eat breakfast'.

This week, the children will prove why they should be chosen ahead of their peers, using a Balloon Argument structure: Everyone is about to escape a desert island in a balloon, but unfortunately there is only space for one less than the total trying to escape. Who should escape and who should stay behind?

Next week, we will use the successful BBC programme structure of Traitors (based upon the game 'Werewolves and Villagers') to see what we have learnt when it is in an all-against-all setting.

It's only been a few weeks since we have been back, but the SCA has already been busy organising events for this coming year. We would firstly like to say thank you to all the parents that joined us for the coffee morning; it was great to see so many new and regular faces.

The students have been buzzing with excitement over the launch of our new Art & Design Curriculum! Focusing on both traditional and modern mediums, the program will encourage creativity and selfexpression while helping students build practical skills.

Our Pre-Prep students kicked things off by celebrating International Dot Day, inspired by Peter H. 

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Reynolds' book The Dot. They explored different techniques, including drawing, painting, and oil pastel resist, to create vibrant dots now proudly displayed outside the new Art Room.

Year 3 has been learning how to highlight and shade with oil pastels, drawing doves inspired by Picasso and International Peace Day. Year 4 has focused on lines, shading, and focal points for their autumnthemed project. Year 5 is diving into lessons on tone and value, while Year 6 has been exploring the science of colour and mixing a full spectrum of colours (ask them why printers use CMYK ink!).

The energy and creativity in the Art Room are truly inspiring as students immerse themselves in these projects. We are excited to see their artistic journeys unfold throughout the year. - Can you think of any synonyms or antonyms for the word \_\_\_\_\_? (*Prep Only*)




#### Grandparents' Tea Reminder
