Dear Parents,

Another week done—and can you believe we have just a week and a half left before the Christmas holidays? Time really does fly in School!

It was such a pleasure to see so many of you at Parents' Evening on Tuesday and Thursday.

Every year, I'm amazed by how much progress pupils make in the short months between September and Christmas—a true testament to their hard work and determination. I hope you left your meetings feeling uplifted by the many positives shared about your child's achievements, as well as with a clear sense of the next steps in their individual learning journey. These evenings are such a valuable chance for us to come together, reflect, and support your child as a team.

On Wednesday, we held our annual Charity Assembly, a special tradition introduced four years ago. Our Year 6 pupils choose a charity that resonates with them - whether due to a personal connection or local cause deserving of support and presents their case to their peers. After an initial vote in Year 6, three finalists are chosen to present to the whole school. During the assembly, pupils listen to the finalists' presentations and vote for the charity that inspires them most. The winning charity becomes our official charity for the year, with funds raised from various events going to support their work. We also invite representatives from the chosen charity to speak to the pupils and collect donations at the end of the year. This year, I was incredibly proud of our finalists-Elliot and Harnoop, Jack and Jacob, and Lily and Neve —who spoke confidently and passionately in front of the School. After the votes were counted, we are thrilled to announce that the chosen charity is **Epilepsy Society**, a cause particularly important to Jack due to his personal connection. We are excited to support this vital charity over the coming year.

This week, we also welcomed the final Open Morning of the term for prospective parents, which served as a brilliant lead-up to today's Reception Assessments for prospective pupils. It was such a delight to welcome so many little ones, all full of curiosity and excitement about the possibility of joining the St. Christopher's family next September. We'd expected a few nerves (and perhaps a tear or two - quite understandable on such a big day!), but this cohort of tiny visitors was calm, confident, and utterly charming.

On a sadder note, I'd like to share some staff news. At the end of this academic year in July, we will be saying goodbye to the wonderful Mrs. Jones. 
Year 4 Mission to Mars!

Last week, Year 4 visited the amazing Natural History Museum in South Kensington, London, to take part in a LEGO Robotics workshop.

After taking a train to Victoria and a busy London Underground tube to the museum, the children left their possessions in the schools' area before exploring the Evolution Gallery to find answers to Mrs Morris's fiendish Stone Age quiz. Looking at the lifelike displays of a Neathanderthal and early Homo Sapien, as well as the wide variety of skulls, tools and weapons on show, the pupils extended their current Humanities learning about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages.

After lunch, the pupils had a chance to explore some more of the museum before taking part in the main event with the NHM's knowledgeable, kind and helpful adults: Fatima and Pat.

The children worked in teams of two and three to programme and build model Mars rovers to carry out a variety of tasks from LEGO sets. The pupils did amazingly well and applied their confidence with iPads and previous coding learning in Scratch to take control of their technologically

Words of the Week

In our continuing effort to build a rich and varied vocabulary, this week our new Word of the Week for Pre-prep children is the word doubtful, while Prep children is oration. Below are some simple and fun ways to incorporate these words into everyday life at home.

Pre-Prep: Doubtful

(Definition: feeling uncertain or unsure about

For younger children, engaging with this word can be as simple as weaving it into everyday conversations:

- 1. Role Play: Act out scenarios that involve making decisions. For example, pretend to choose between two outfits or snacks and say, "I'm feeling doubtful about which one to pick!"
- 2. Story Time: While reading books together, pause to ask, "Do you think this character feels doubtful about what's happening?"
- 3. Discuss Feelings: Encourage your child to use the word to describe their own emotions. For instance, if they hesitate before trying something new, you could say, "It's okay to feel doubtful sometimes. Let's talk about it!"

Prep: Oration

(Definition: a formal speech delivered to an audience.)

For older children, this is a fantastic opportunity to build confidence and communication skills:

- 1. Family Speech Time: Encourage your child to prepare a short speech about something they love - perhaps a favorite hobby or a recent adventure. Gather the family as the audience for their "oration."
- 2. Historical Explorations: Share examples of famous orations, such as Martin Luther King Jr.'s "I Have a Dream" speech. Discuss why it was powerful and memorable.
- 3. Everyday Practice: While having dinner, ask your child to "present" their day in an oration style. This is a fun way to turn routine chats into an exercise in expression.

By using these words in various contexts, children can deepen their understanding while enjoying the learning process. Let us know how your family incorporates these words this week!
