Dear Parents,

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a joyous and restful Christmas holiday. It has been a strange start to the term, as I was unwell on Tuesday and Wednesday, but I thoroughly enjoyed seeing the pupils on Thursday. It is so lovely to see

everyone back and settling into the routine of school life once again.

You will have received the news about our merger with St. Dunstan's Education Group, announced on Monday. On behalf of Mrs. Curtis and our entire Board of Governors, I want to emphasise how enthusiastic we are about this proactive step forward. St. Christopher's is already in a strong position, but this merger represents a chance to enhance our offerings, strengthen our foundations, and ensure resilience in an ever-changing educational landscape. Unlike many mergers that occur out of necessity, this partnership is a deliberate and forward-thinking choice, made with the best interests of our pupils at heart. It was wonderful to see so many of you at the meeting on Thursday, and I hope you found it helpful to meet Mr. Hewlett in person, and his insights reassured you about the incredible opportunities this partnership brings. Together, we can reinvest in key areas, from curriculum development to extracurricular activities, ensuring that St. Christopher's continues to thrive for years to come. This collaboration also aligns beautifully with our values: a commitment to highquality education, inclusivity, and holistic growth. St. Dunstan's shares our ethos, making them a natural fit. I want to assure you that nothing will change in the day-to-day life of St. Christopher's. Our character, culture, and ethos will remain the same. This merger is about building on what we already do so well and opening new doors for our students to succeed and grow.

I was going to lead our back-to-school assembly on Tuesday, but as I was unwell, Mrs. West kindly stepped in. The theme of the assembly was exploration and adventure, setting the tone for a term filled with curiosity, growth, and resilience. The children were invited to imagine themselves as explorers, but instead of being equipped with maps, torches, tents, and compasses, they thought about essential tools like curiosity, kindness, and resilience. They reflected on the adventures of the holiday break and looked ahead to the treasures this term holds. It was wonderful to hear how much the children enjoyed it and to see their excitement for the months ahead.

On Friday, Miss Rule and I held a meeting with Year 4 parents to discuss the 11+ process, addressing concerns about secondary school transfer. We reassured families that Year 4 is too early to focus on these decisions and that Year 5 is the ideal time to start preparing. We also cautioned against narrowing options prematurely, as children's interests and strengths evolve between Year 4 and Year 6, and decisions made too early may no longer align with their needs. Our merger with St. Dunstan's provides additional avenues helping all students reach their potential. We clarified that through-schools often prioritise scholarships for Year 7 intakes and that secondary schools select students based on academic and social readiness, not early applications. Our approach to the 11+ is tailored to each child, ensuring they are prepared without stress, and our post-11+ curriculum offers valuable skills like life skills, public speaking, and coding. Staying at St. Christopher's through Year 6 also provides the children with leadership opportunities and lasting friendships. We are here to guide families through this process when the time is right to ensure the best outcomes for each child.

A quick update on a few important bits of admin: Please be aware that <u>there will be no after school</u> <u>Clubs or SCAMPS on Tuesday, 25th February</u>, as all staff will be undergoing their annual safeguarding training. As the provider for this training has limited availability, we were obliged to choose this date and, unfortunately, we are therefore unable to offer clubs on that day or SCAMPS past 4pm. Therefore, all children will need to be picked up at the usual end of the school day. Additionally, as you may recall, Miss Leaf got married over Christmas and will now be known as Mrs. Titchener which we will now all need to get used to!
